Rules and guidelines for writing essays in English

Writing an essay in English is one of the most important tasks in the tests. There are different types of essays in English, but each must comply with the structure and specific rules of writing. Writing an essay in English

- 1. Before you start writing an essay, you should "brainstorm" to collect all thoughts and arrange everything on the shelves.
- 2. To do this, there is a plan that explains step by step what to do.
- 3. Read the title of the essay and emphasize the keywords.
- 4. Decide for yourself whether you agree with the statement in question or not. Make a list of arguments for the statement.
- 5. Make a list of arguments against the claim. Formulate your own opinion.
- 6. Start writing an essay.
- 7. Use binding words and input constructs. These are

7 simple points to rely on when you write an essay.

Essay structure by English language

Both in Russian and English, the work consists of three parts: an introduction, the main part and the conclusion. However, each of the parts has its own nuances and rules.

Introduction: In the introduction, the task of the author of the essay is to tell the reader what this essay is about. This can be done by paraphrasing the title or thesis (if any), or by asking rhetorical questions. The first option is used more often. Usually the introduction consists of 3-5 sentences.

The Main Body: In the main body, the main task of the author is to present his ideas and arguments for or against the thesis. It is mandatory to use examples in the main body: from literature, from news or from personal experience. The main part of the essay takes up most of it, as it tells everything and everything.

Conclusion: In conclusion, the author of the essay must draw conclusions and sum up or express his opinion. This can also be done by paraphrasing a thesis (but it should also be different from the introduction), summarizing arguments or calling the reader to action. The length of the conclusion should be approximately the same as the length of the introduction.
